WOMEN OVERCOMING VIOLENCE

The 4th War Resisters International Women's Conference will be held in Bangkok, Thailand from November 25th to December 1st 1992. The conference is open to 150 women active at the grassroots level in nonviolent social change - but there are opportunities for others to input or participate in the process. INNATE NONVIOLENCE PICNIC - Belfast

The third annual nonviolence picnic will be held on Sunday 22nd June from 12 noon to 4 pm.
