Youth for Peace Bike-a-thon; Malin to Mizen

Youth for Peace are cycling from Malin Head in Donegal to Mizen Head in Cork in August. The aim is to bring a message of peace and understanding, talking to people from all backgrounds as they go, build relationships among young people, and raise funds for a minibus. The itinerary is (distance in miles in brackets) 6th August Malin Head-Derry (30 miles); 7th Derry-Strabane-Omagh (34); 8th Omagh-Ballygawley-Armagh (36); 9th Armagh-Keady-Crossmaglen (30); 10th Crossmaglen-Dundalk-Drogheda (38); 11th Drogheda-Dublin (31); 12th Dublin; 13th Dublin-Naas-Kildare (33); 14th Kildare-Portlaoise-Kilkenny (60); 15th Kilkenny-Waterford (30); 16th Waterford-Dungarvan-Youghal (49); 17th Youghal-Cork (32); 18th Cork-Skibbereen (60); 19th Skibbereen-Mizen Head-Skibbereen (56). Horseshoe Ecology Centre

Initial plans are available for the Horseshoe Ecology Centre in north Belfast which has a 35 acre site for all manner of things energetic and ecological - including horticultural, animal, solar, wind - It is intended to be a highly productive site which would create a small number of jobs and be somewhere "adults and children from the city and beyond can enjoy, understand, and learn to be part of, a natural world". Next step is to raise £80,000 for a full feasibility study. The initial proposals are contained in a 33-page (A4) booklet. NEVE SHALOM / WAHAT AL-SALAM (NS/WAS)

NS/WAS is a cooperative village of Jews and Palestinians half way between Tel Aviv and Jerusalem in Israel, now with 110 people living there. They run a nursery, kindergarten and primary school for themselves and their area, and a School for Peace, plus a hotel and youth hostel for visitors. Work by the School for Peace includes facilitation of Jewish/Palestinian encounters and this has been written up in the book "Walking the tightrope: Encounters between Jewish and Palestinian Youth in Israel" (available from INNATE address at £8 including postage, cheques payable to 'Nonviolent Action Training project').
