ALTERNATIVES TO VIOLENCE PROJECT / AVP

AVP is an experiential programmes working in both prisons and the community, using workshops which focus on affirmation, communication, co-operation and creative conflict resolution. Participants progress through basic, second level, and training for facilitators workshops. AVP Ireland has two Basic workshops happening shortly; Dublin (Swanbrook) 11 - 13 October, and Cork 18 - 20 October. Dublin City Council has passed a motion, moved by Green Party councillor Claire Wheeler, that among other things the Council draws up a code of practice on chemical fertilisers, pesticides and fungicides by the Parks Department, launches a public awareness campaign on the hazards of chemical weed control and the need to introduce ecologically-friendly landscaping, and timetables a complete phasing out of Paraquat use.
